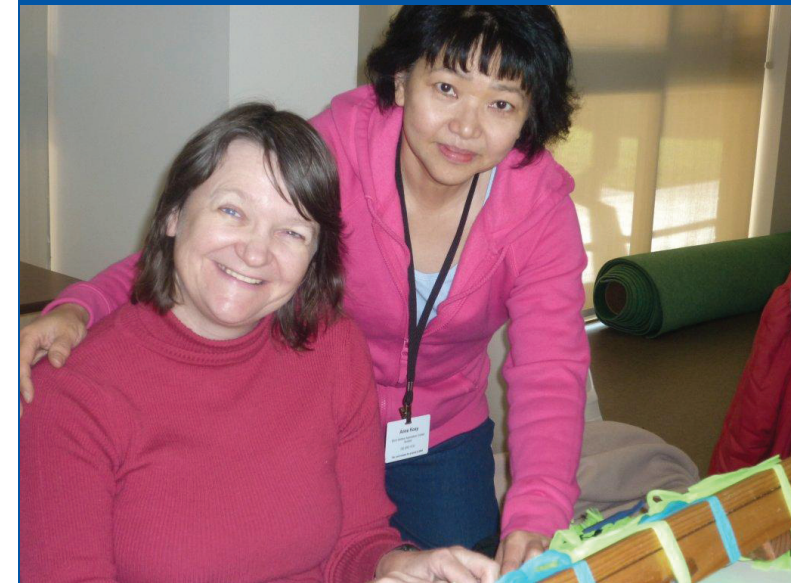

BWA's focus is to promote and assist our members in maintaining their independence and individual lifestyles.
